Dear PHPA Members:

The Hollywood Bowl and the John Anson Ford Amphitheatre's 2009 Seasons are nearly upon us. We are again requesting your help in stopping overflights by helicopters and other aircraft during our open-air Symphony Music Concerts at the Bowl and the John Anson Ford Amphitheatre. We are very grateful for the fine cooperation of the PHPA in this regard over the years.

A directive to your pilots would be greatly appreciated by the Hollywood Bowl and the John Anson Ford Amphitheatre and its audiences. **WE WILL CONTINUE TO UTILIZE GROUND STROBE LIGHTS TO SUPPLEMENT THE USE OF OUR SEARCHLIGHTS.** These flashing strobe lights will be used with our searchlights during the time period and days listed below. Here is the information that should be included in the bulletin to your pilots:

The Summertime Music Concerts will resume in the outdoor Hollywood Bowl and the John Anson Ford Amphitheatre from **June 7, 2009 through October 3, 2009** between 1800 and 2400 (6PM to 12 Midnight, Los Angeles Time), Monday through Sunday.

The HOLLYWOOD BOWL and the JOHN ANSON FORD AMPHITHEATRE are located five miles Southeast of Burbank-Glendale-Pasadena Airport, and 15 miles North/Northeast of Los Angeles International Airport, near the intersection of airways V186, V459, and V201. The Bowl area is defined visually with two white searchlight beams crossed in the sky above the stage and **WHITE STROBE LIGHTS ON THE GROUND**. The Ford Amphitheatre is defined either by all the lights mentioned or by **ONE SINGLE STROBE LIGHT** (if the Bowl is not operating concurrently). We ask that pilots, if at all possible, fly over the Griffith Park Observatory area rather than Lake Hollywood or Cahuenga Pass since both locations are adjacent to the Ford Amphitheatre and the Hollywood Bowl.

I appreciate your courtesy in cooperating with the above request. Thank you again on behalf of the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra, the Hollywood Bowl Orchestra and the more than one million people who attend the Bowl and the John Anson Ford Amphitheatre each summer.
